Habitat: Forests of the Western US into Canada and Alaska

Diet: Mainly water plants

Life Cycle: Calves, mostly twins are born in the early summer, weighing only 30 pounds. At five days old they can outrun a human. They stay with their mothers until the following mating season. They can live 15-20 years in the wild.

Reproductive Cycle: They breed in the fall, and calve in the early summer months.

Hunting Regulations: Hunting season in Alaska is August 25 to September 25. A permit is required to hunt in Alaska, but only one can be taken.

Migration: Moose group up in the winter and separate during the summer.

Classification: Mammal

Fun Fact: Their antlers are used for fighting
