Habitat

- Mountain tops in North America
- Mountains of western Montana and Idaho
- Mountains eastern of Washington state northward into Alaska

Reproductive Cycle

- Breeding season is November
- 1-2 born in April, May, or June

Diet

- Scrubs
- Grasses
- Sedges
- Lichens

Life Cycle

- Can run within an hour of birth
- They follow their mom to the herd in 3 to 4 days
- Live about 10 years

Migration

- Winter lowers them to lower elevation

Hunting Regulations

- Report in 10 days' time span
- Needs a tag
- September- December

Classifications

- Kids are offsprings
- Female-Nannies
- Male- Billies
- Herd is a group
