- Live in the northwestern mountains and down into the western coastal areas. They also live throughout western Canada and Alaska
- They like to live in places devoid of humans
- Grizzlies are omnivores and eat everything from berries and fish to elk and moose
- Females usually give birth in January and February
- Cubs stay with their mothers until their second summers
- Grizzlies have to give birth to at least two cubs, but sometimes have three, and rarely four
- They usually live 20 to 25 years
- Can not be hunted yet
- Next fall they can possibly be hunted in the lower 48 states
- At the end of the summer, they eat as much as possible to accumulate fat for hibernation
- Usually they only migrate to find food sources, and they usually go up to Alaska
- Fun Fact: Most Grizzlies can run faster than a fast horse
